Metallica's 2025 Tour: A Thunderous Return to the Global Stage

In 2025, Metallica proves once again that they are not just a band—they're a movement. With the launch of the second leg of their highly anticipated *M72 World Tour*, the legendary metal titans are storming stadiums and arenas across continents, bringing their signature intensity, sonic precision, and unmatched stage presence to a new generation of fans.

The inclusion of 72 Seasons tracks like "Lux Æterna" and "If Darkness Had a Son" proves the band's newer material holds its own alongside the classics.

What's particularly striking is how well Metallica's performances maintain energy and precision. James Hetfield's vocals are as fierce as ever, Kirk Hammett's solos remain blistering, Lars Ulrich's drumming is machine-tight, and Robert Trujillo brings a kinetic energy that anchors the band's groove with ferocity.



True to form, Metallica is using the tour not just to entertain but to give back. Their All Within My Hands foundation continues its philanthropic mission, hosting local charity events and donating proceeds to food banks and disaster relief organizations in each tour city. This aspect of the tour reinforces the band's commitment to being a positive force beyond the stage.

At this point in their career, Metallica could coast on legacy alone. But this tour makes it clear: they're not interested in slowing down.

The M72 World Tour is not just a celebration of what they've done—it's a statement about what they're still capable of.

As fans across the globe roar along to every riff and chorus, one thing is certain: Metallica is still writing history, one thunderous night at a time.

EVAN LONGORIA SET TO SIGN ONE-DAY CONTRACT TO RETIRE AS A TAMPA BAY RAY

From the Tampa Bay Rays
Press Release

The Tampa Bay Rays have announced plans to sign third baseman Evan Longoria to a ceremonial one-day contract ahead of the 16-year veteran's official retirement from Major League Baseball. Longoria's legacy and impact with the club will be honored during a pregame ceremony before the Rays take on the Miami Marlins on Saturday, June 7 at 4:10 p.m. E.T. at George M. Steinbrenner Field.

"Evan Longoria embodies what it means to be a Tampa Bay Ray. From the moment he stepped on the field, he brought excellence, leadership, and a competitive spirit that shaped the identity of this franchise," said Tampa Bay Rays Principal Owner Stuart Sternberg. "He, more than anyone, helped transform the Devil Rays into the Rays, and we are honored to welcome him home as he retires in the uniform where it all began."

The 39-year-old spent his first 10 major league seasons with the Rays from 2008-17 after being selected by the club in the first round (No. 3 overall) of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft out of California State University, Long Beach. During his stint in Tampa Bay, Longoria was tabbed for three All-Star selections and three Gold Glove awards while earning three top-10 finishes and six top-20 finishes in American League (AL) Most Valuable Player voting. He was named AL Rookie of the Year in 2008 and was tabbed as the 2009 AL Silver Slugger recipient at third base, becoming the second player in team history to earn a Silver Slugger award, along with Carlos Peña in 2007 (first base).

"Evan Longoria's place in Rays history is unmatched," said Rays President of Baseball Operations Erik Neander. "Over his tenure in Tampa Bay, he established himself as the cornerstone of our franchise, earning three All-Star selections, three Gold Gloves, a Silver Slugger, and becoming the first Ray to be named American League Rookie of the Year. He also delivered one of the most unforgettable moments in baseball history with his walk-off home run in Game 162. Evan leaves the game as our all-time leader in nearly every major offensive category. He not only defined an era of Rays baseball—he helped put us on the map. His impact, both on and off the field, laid the foundation for our success, and it's a privilege to celebrate his legacy."

The California native helped guide the Rays to the first four postseason appearances in franchise history, including a World Series run during his rookie season in 2008. Longoria delivered a walk-off home run in "Game 162" against the Red Sox in 2011, becoming the second player to send his team to the postseason by hitting a walk-off home run in the final game of the regular season along with Bobby Thomson's "Shot Heard 'Round the World" for the New York Giants in 1951.

"It was a personal honor of mine to be able to have a relationship with Evan and watch him play," said Rays Manager Kevin Cash. "His work ethic, along with his performance, defines him as the best to ever put on a Rays uniform. The teammate he was and the way he and his wife, Jaime, supported our community illustrated how much he cared. It is only fitting that he ends his career as a Ray because of all the contributions that he made to the organization over his career".

Longoria recorded 618 extra-base hits during his Rays tenure, the third most by a third baseman over his first 10 major league seasons behind Nolan Arenado (668) and Eddie Matthews (648). His 338 doubles are tied with Arenado for the third most behind Wade Boggs (400) and David Wright (345). He recorded nine 20-homer seasons with the Rays, tied with Kyle Seager for the second most in AL history by a third baseman behind Graig Nettles (10).

Longoria is the Rays all-time franchise leader in games (1,435), runs (780), doubles (338), home runs (261), extra-base hits (618), RBI (892), walks (569), intentional walks (77), total bases (2,630), sacrifice flies (76) and walk-off RBI (eight). He is one of eight players leading one of the 30 current major league franchises in games, doubles, home runs, extra-base hits and RBI, joining Hank Aaron (Braves), George Brett (Royals), Todd Helton (Rockies), Stan Musial (Cardinals), Luis Gonzalez (Diamondbacks), Cal Ripken Jr. (Orioles) and Ryan Zimmerman (Nationals).

From the Revolutionary War to the Civil War, World Wars I and II, and numerous conflicts thereafter, the Army has consistently answered the call to defend the nation's interests and uphold democratic values. Each generation of Soldiers has built upon the legacy of those before, adapting to new challenges and technologies while maintaining the core values of duty, honor, and country.

Reflecting on the past few decades, the Army has undergone significant transformations to meet evolving global threats. The end of the Cold War brought about a shift in focus, leading to involvement in humanitarian and peacekeeping missions in regions like Somalia, Haiti, Rwanda, Bosnia, Herzegovina, and Kosovo. These operations highlighted the Army's versatility in addressing complex international crises, extending beyond traditional combat roles.

The events of September 11, 2001, marked a turning point, ushering in an era defined by the Global War on Terror. The Army rapidly expanded its capabilities and end strength to engage in prolonged operations in Afghanistan and Iraq. Operation Enduring Freedom commenced in October 2001, aiming to dismantle terrorist networks and stabilize the region. The subsequent invasion of Iraq in 2003 further demonstrated the Army's capacity to conduct large-scale, sustained operations, with over 1.5 million Soldiers deploying during nearly nine years of engagement.

These extensive campaigns have provided invaluable lessons in military strategy, counterinsurgency, and nation-building. The importance of understanding local cultures, building partnerships with indigenous forces and adapting to asymmetric warfare became evident. The Army's experiences in these theaters have informed training, doctrine, and leadership development, ensuring that future operations are approached with greater insight and preparedness.




Commemorating the 250th Anniversary

To commemorate this significant anniversary, the Army has planned a range of events and initiatives. A notable highlight is the special exhibition titled "Call to Arms: The Soldier and the Revolutionary War" at the National Museum of the United States Army, located at 1775 Liberty Drive, Fort Belvoir, Virginia. The museum officially opened to the public on November 11, 2020, and is open daily from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Admission is free, and we recommend purchasing general admission tickets to ensure the most enjoyable visitor experience. This exhibition will open to the public on June 7, 2025, offering visitors a glimpse into the lives of early American Soldiers and the Army's foundational role in securing independence. Additionally, the Opening the Vault: Washington and Franklin exhibit at the National Archives Museum in Washington, D.C., will be on display from May 7 to August 6, 2025. This exhibit features historic, handwritten documents of two Founding Fathers: George Washington, the first President, and Benjamin Franklin. These items highlight landmark milestones in American history, commemorating the first Commander-in-Chief of the Continental Army and the first Postmaster General. These historic treasures also celebrate the 250th anniversary of the establishment of the U.S. Army and the U.S. Postal Service. The museum is open daily from 10 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., and admission is free. For more information, visit archives.gov.

Over my 32-year career in the Army, I witnessed firsthand the evolution of our military force. Commissioned as a second lieutenant at the University of Tennessee on June 8, 1984, and retiring from the Pentagon on April 1, 2016, my journey encompassed a period of profound change and growth within the Army. From the Cold War's tense standoffs to the rapid deployments of the post-9/11 era, I observed the Army's adaptability and unwavering commitment to its mission. The dedication of my fellow Soldiers, the advancements in technology and strategy, and the lessons learned from each operation have left an indelible mark on me. As we celebrate this 250th anniversary, I reflect with pride on the Army's enduring legacy and its role in shaping our nation's history.



As the Army celebrates its 250th anniversary, it presents an opportunity to reflect on its storied past and look forward to the future. The challenges ahead will undoubtedly differ from those of the past, but the Army's core mission remains unchanged: to fight and win the nation's wars. With continued adaptability, innovation, and commitment, the Army stands ready to face whatever lies ahead, honoring its legacy while forging a path forward.






